Author Interview Questionnaire

1. What made you decide to become a writer? (This will also be on the blog)

I didn't exactly decide to become a writer. It's something I always did, an aspect of who I am. A combination of things made me decide to write for publication, but being without a job when my children started school was a biggie. It was the perfect time to recommit myself to writing, even though life interfered enough over the years to put writing aside several times. I always came back because I couldn't do otherwise!

2. How long did it take to get published the first time and how did it happen?

At one time or another, I tried my hand at everything from poetry to children's picture books to comedy sketches to teleplays. When I joined RWA, I recommitted to writing for publication, but had been an RWA member for right at 23 years before I sold. I pitched to a Berkley editor in the spring of 2006, followed up on the submission in early 2007, and was offered my very first contact a few weeks later. What a high!

3. What would you do differently the next time?

What would I do differently? How long do you have?

Seriously, the Number One thing I'd do differently is to focus more on my strengths as a writer, and focus more energy on writing, not revising.

4. What advice would you give an aspiring author?

Identify your strengths and make those your mantra, and then persist!

5. What (or who) inspires or influences your writing?

Every author I read inspires me to improve, develop, and evolve as a writer.

6. Do you have any works in progress you'd like to tell us about?

I'm working on Book 3 in the vampire series, and on several other projects including a cozy mystery series.

Worse than Jo-Jo's bad jokes, a psychotic vampire with a murderous agenda has followed Jo-Jo to Florida, putting everyone close to Cesca in danger. She must discover what the not-so-comic mess has to do with an energy-sapping plague knocking off the country's head vamps. Even it kills her. Again.

My debut book that's currently out is La Vida Vampire, Berkley trade. The short blurb is:

The revision process for my debut book, *La Vida Vampire*, went wonderfully well! I enjoy the layering process of revisions, and my editor's comments were aimed at clarifying various points and more tightly weaving certain story threads.
